SAINT OF THE WEEK: ST SCHOLASTICA — MONDAY 10TH FEBRUARY

Saint Scholastica was the twin sister of St Benedict and shared the same ideals. Both established religious communities within a few miles from each other in Italy. Born in 480 of wealthy parents, Scholastica and Benedict were brought up together until he left central Italy for Rome to continue his studies. Little is known of Scholastica's early life. She founded a religious community for women near Monte Cassino. The twins visited each other once a year in a farmhouse as Scholastica was not permitted inside the monastery. They spent these times discussing spiritual matters. According to the *Dialogues of St. Gregory the Great*, the brother and sister spent their last day



together in prayer and conversation. Scholastica sensed her death was close at hand and she begged Benedict to stay with her until the next day but he refused not wanting to be away from his community, so she prayed and to God and a severe storm prevented him from travelling. She said if he wouldn't grant her wish, she knew God would! They both gave priority to God, deepening their friendship with him through prayer. They sacrificed some of the opportunities they would have had to be together as brother and sister in order better to fulfil their vocation to the religious life. In coming closer to Christ, however, they found they were also closer to each other.
