CORONAVIRUS UPDATE

DECREE ISSUED BY TERENCE PATRICK DRAINEY BISHOP OF MIDDLESBROUGH PASTORAL MEASURES TO IMPLEMENTED TO REDUCE RISKS OF COVID-19 CORONAVIRUS TRANSMISSION

Having received professional advice and as part of a united response on the part of the Catholic Bishops of England and Wales, in response to the Covid-19 virus, in order to reduce possible transmission, by this decree I instruct that the following pastoral measures be implemented in all churches and chapels of my diocese, effective from 14th March, 2020:

- → The sign of peace is to be suspended at Mass.
- → Holy Communion from the Chalice shall cease to be offered to the lay faithful. The practice of intinction is NOT to be introduced as an alternative.
- Those who receive Holy Communion on the tongue should receive on the hand instead. Their doing this represents an act of loving charity to their community.
- → Holy water stoups are to be emptied.
- Ministers should wash and also sanitise their hands before and after distributing Holy Communion.
- → Shared towels should not be used in toilet areas or the sacristy.
- → Shared hymnbooks and Mass books should cease to be
- → Collection baskets or bags should be available for the offertory collections on the way out of Mass and not passed up and down the aisles at the offertory.
- → On Good Friday, the traditional 'Veneration of the Cross' is to be observed by a simple genuflection.

In addition to the points above the Bishops Conference of England and Wales have instructed that:

- Newsletters once used must not be left for others to use and should be taken home.
- → Anyone with cold or flu symptoms to refrain from attending Mass and liturgies, the Sacrament of reconciliation, or any parish social events.
- Suspend all catering, including teas, coffees etc. at parish gatherings where multiple people touch mugs, tea pots, utensils, biscuits etc.

If the virus spreads within the parish or the local community we will need to take further measures so If you are unfortunate enough to test positive for the virus please let us know immediately.
